Dear Pony Clubber:

We're thrilled you are considering participating in this year's Sierra Pacific Regional Camp at Lone Tree Farm, June 24th-June 27th. This is the first time our region has hosted camp at this facility and we are very excited to make new Pony Club memories at this beautiful location. We are hard at work creating the best possible learning and fun experience for all. This camp is open to all youth and adult members at all riding levels. To safely participate at camp, riders **must** be comfortable riding off of a lead/longe line in an open area. **We will continue to comply with any current COVID protocols as per the CDC. Please come prepared to wear masks and socially distance as appropriate.** Here are some of the details:

The Schedule:

Camp begins Thursday with arrival between 3 and 7pm. There will be no riding on Thursday as part of camp. Friday and Saturday will consist of morning and afternoon lessons, HM and extra activities. Sunday morning we will wrap up with one final lesson and aim to have everyone on the road by lunchtime.

Please plan to arrive on Thursday in time to settle in and join everyone for dinner at 6pm and our first camp meeting, where we will go over logistics, and have a chance to meet fellow campers.

Sunday is a half day at camp. To support everyone getting home we will have all camp activities completed by noon and provide bag lunches to take on the road.

Lessons:

Everyone will have 2 group lessons each day both Friday and Saturday. You will have the opportunity to select your disciplines, with a flat lesson in the morning and a jump lesson in the afternoon. We will try to accommodate Dressage and HSE/SJ track riders who would rather do a flat or stadium jumping lesson in the afternoon.

Please indicate on your registration paperwork whether you would like to do flat or jump in the afternoon and if you would rather show jump than do cross country.

HM Activities:

In addition to mounted lessons, each day there will be an additional learning opportunity to fulfill Pony Club's mission to address horse management in all we do. Our plan is to have lessons covering a number of certification appropriate topics. Please be sure to indicate on your paperwork whether there are particular topics you would like taught. There may also be additional opportunities to learn and share with trainers and other pony clubbers.

Horse and Rider Fitness:

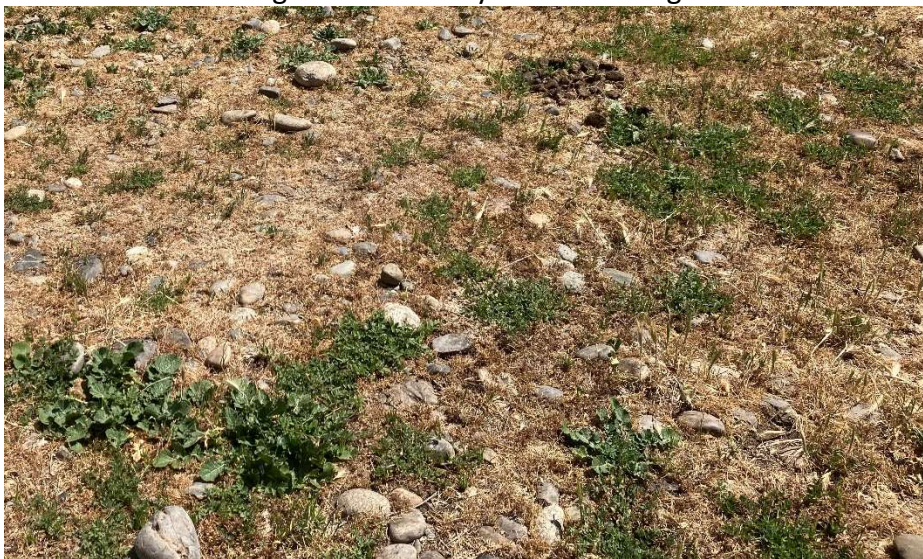
Participating in camp is a rigorous 3 days. Horses, ponies and their riders MUST be fit enough to ride for up to 3 hours per day. Bringing a mount to camp that is not fit enough is both a welfare and safety issue. Mounts must be appropriately conditioned to camp. Horses deemed to be showing signs of distress or lack of conditioning during lessons may be excused. If your horse or pony is not able to participate in more than one lesson per day due to fitness or age please indicate this on your registration paperwork.

Meals:

Camp fees include 9 meals, from dinner on Thursday evening through a bagged lunch on Sunday. We do not have a caterer and the region will be providing meals, as such we will be **needing volunteers to help with meal preparation** and options will be hearty but limited. Vegetarian options will be available however we will not be able to accommodate other dietary limitations. If you would like to opt out of camp meals and provide your own that is an option however please note- there should be no outdoor cooking in the camping area and due to VERY limited space and facilities there will be no access to the facility cooking area.

People Accommodations:

Lone Tree Farm is set in a lovely river valley. The main barn, instructor housing, food prep area and showers are located as you first enter the property on top of a ridge before you descend down into the valley. There is a river running through the valley floor and camping areas, pipe panel horse stalls, and riding areas run alongside the river. Conditions are typically favorable for swimming in parts of the river so make sure to bring a swimsuit and water/rock friendly shoes! There are several compost outhouses and additionally we will be bringing in several porta potties and hand washing stations. Please note, the camping areas have a large amount of sizeable river rock on the surface. The photo below has been included to emphasize how significant the rocks are. If you are camping in a tent I would strongly recommend the use of a cot or a VERY thick air mattress. I also would recommend bringing along some gardening gloves in case you want to move some of the rocks around to clear out an area. As the food preparation area is quite a hike we will likely be eating our meals in the valley at our campsites. You will need to bring chairs and may want a folding table as well.



Horse Accommodations:

Lone Tree has pipe panel stalls for the horses. The majority of the stalls are 12x12 but there are a limited number of oversize 12x16 stalls. The oversize stalls cost an additional \$10/day and will be given out to the first people who request them and submit a complete application including payment. There are limited number of stalls available in the main barn for an additional \$15/day. Additional stall fees will be payable to Sierra Pacific Region and will be collected at camp. We are including 2 bags of shavings in the camp fees. This is typically sufficient for most horses for the length of the stay. If you need more, there will be additional bags for purchase for \$10/each (payable in cash) or you may bring your own.

Non-Riders Attending Camp:

Parents and other family members are welcome and encouraged to attend Pony Club Camp. Your fee for the weekend will include meals and accommodations (a nominal charge paid to the facility).

Fees:

Pony Club Member \$485 (this includes all lessons, horse fees, camping and meals)
Non-riding family member \$160 (this includes meals and tent camping)

Number of spaces:

Please complete and return the Regional Camp Application ASAP. We will **only have 40 spots available** for this exceptional experience and spaces will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. Completed applications can be scanned/photographed and submitted by email, checks can be mailed in. **Spots will be held as long as checks are received within 7 days of receipt of application.** Reserve your spot today to avoid disappointment!
