Deadline: Registration will Open on Apr 15th and Close on May 9th. - **No refunds after entries close.**

****NEW!**** Relay Team – Build your own "Dream Team." Must be 4 different people, one to do each phase, can be a combination of any ages. Teams can be made up of moms, dads, siblings, friends... Members of the relay team will compete according to their age/gender specifications of that phase and their score will be added to the team's overall score. Highest team score wins! Relay team members do not have to be Pony Club members to compete. Competitors who are already competing in the entire rally can have their score count towards a team. Phase that each relay member is competing in must be declared prior to competition. Competition rules for each phase will still be followed. Horse Management scores will not be counted towards Relay Team scores but all riders must still receive a Safety Check and abide by all rules as stated for the Ride Phase of USPC Tetrathlon in the 2022 Rulebook. If any horses are not in the Rally they will be stabled separately from Rally Barn and barn remains closed to non-rally competitors. ***

Horse Management – Horse Management will start on Friday after official briefing and will continue through Sunday. Anyone bringing a horse and participating in the ride phase will be participating in Horse Management, which requires that horses be to the venue before official start time and Horse Inspections.

Tentative schedule (subject to change)

- **Friday – Arrival, Set Up, Briefing, Horse Inspections**
- **Saturday AM – Ride Phase**
- **Saturday PM – Shoot Phase**
- **Saturday PM - Run Phase**
- **Sunday Mid-AM - Swim Phase**

General Info: Overnight horse accommodations are available. In accordance with facility rules vaccination records must be submitted prior to arrival for overnight stays. Designated overnight paddocks are large paddocks with pipe panel fencing, no cover, and deep sand footing (we are in the sand dunes). Members are expected to bring their own horse's feed and overnight equipment. Mornings and evenings can be foggy, bring warm clothes and possibly blankets for horses.

Accommodations: There are hotels close by in Marina. No tent camping allowed on site. Camping can be accommodated if in a fully self-contained living quarters or camper trailer. Facility does not have any hookups for electricity, water, or sewage. No showers at facility.

Pool Info:

Swim phase will be held at Monterey Sports Center located at 301 E Franklin St, Monterey. Unfortunately, they do not have start blocks so we will not be starting off of blocks. Plan to start from in the pool. ALL SPECTATORS, COACHES, OFFICIALS, ETC MUST PAY TO ENTER - \$8/youth, \$13/adult. This will actually be giving you access to Family Rec Swim time at the Monterey Sports Center and you can stay after competition to swim until Rec Swim finishes at 3:30pm. Competitor's registration fee includes the entry fee for the pool.

Championships Eligibility:

Championships: C1 and above, 12 years old and up. Must meet minimum point requirements

Modified Championships: D2 and above, 10 years old and up. No minimum point requirements

Championships West: July 5-8, 2022

Divisions:

Senior: 18 years old and above, maximum 3'3" jump height, 3000m run, 200m swim, 20 shots
Junior: 16-17 years old, maximum 3' jump height, 3000m run, 200m swim, 20 shots
Intermediate: 14-15 years old, maximum 2'9" jump height, 2000m run, 100m swim, 20 shots
Novice: 12-13 years old, maximum 2'6" jump height, 1000m run, 100m swim, 20 shots
Modified Pre-Novice: 10-11 years old, maximum 2'3" jump height, 500m run, 50m swim, 20 shots

Non-Qualifying

Under 11: 11 yrs and younger, maximum 18" jump height, 500m run, 50m swim, 10 shots
Under 8: 8 years and younger, poles/cross rails jump height, 500m run, 25m swim, 10 shots

Competing Down: Competitors may compete down a height/distance in the ride, run, and swim. Competing down one height/distance will incur 200 penalty points, and any drop there after will be an additional 100 points. For example a senior wishing to jump 2'6" will take a 400 point deduction (200+100+100).

Teams: Each team will consist of three or four riding competitors. Any Pony Club Members in Good Standing with a suitable mount and the maturity to handle competition at this level is welcome. We will attempt to combine individuals from different clubs to make up teams if necessary. Teams may be a mix of all rating levels and ages.

2022 USPC Championships Tetrathlon Information

USPC Handbook and Rules For Tetrathlon 2022

Article 32—Championships Eligibility Process

Each individual Pony Club member who desires to compete at Championships must compete in a regional rally and be judged at the minimum HM level and same competition level in which they intend to compete at Championships. This constitutes the “individual eligibility” of the competitor.

Members wanting to become eligible for Championships must meet the below division criteria.

Modified Pre-Novice—Participate in a standard or modified Tetrathlon rally at the competition level.

Modified Novice—Participate in a standard or modified Tetrathlon rally at the competition level.

Novice—Complete a standard regional Tetrathlon rally at level; earn a total minimum score of 2600 and a minimum score of 550 in the riding phase.

Modified Intermediate—Participate in a standard or modified Tetrathlon rally at the competition level.

Intermediate—Complete a standard regional Tetrathlon rally at level; earn a total minimum score of 2600 and a minimum score of 550 in the riding phase.

Modified Junior—Participate in a standard or modified Tetrathlon rally at the competition level.

Junior—Complete a standard regional Tetrathlon rally at level; earn a total minimum score of 2800 and a minimum score of 550 in the riding phase.

Modified Senior—Participate in a standard or modified Tetrathlon rally at the competition level.

Senior—Complete a standard regional Tetrathlon rally at level; earn a total minimum score of 2800 and a minimum score of 550 in the riding phase

Middle California Championships Qualifying Information

Our region supports eligible members attending Championships. Members who wish to attend must meet age and certification requirements for the discipline of their choice, which includes qualifying at a regional rally or the equivalent. All eligible members are invited to qualify for regional teams. Based on available funds, the Region will pay at least half the entry fee for Middle California competitors for any USPC Championships.
